Report on Experiential Learning Activity (Art) for Classes VI, VII & VIII

Experiential learning is a philosophy and methodology in which educators purposefully engage with students in direct experience and focused reflection in order to increase knowledge, develop skills and clarify values.

Warli Art – Class – VI

The Art Experimental model kit of Warli painting was distributed to the students of Class-VI and demonstration was given under the guidance of the resource person. Students drew the Warli design on the pouch provided by the ELE, with the use of marker pen .The reference picture was drawn on the board by the volunteers.

Lipan Art – Class –VII & VIII

- The art experimental model kit for Lipan art was provided by the ELE to each student .The air dry clay, pieces of mirrors, a magnet and a piece of MDF board was included in the art kit. Instruction was given to the students how to make the clay and stick that on the MDF Board. Students were told to make an impression on the clay using the scale, pen or compass. After this students were told to stick the pieces of mirror on the formed design to give the look of Lipan art.
- As the session involved a lot of interaction and participation every student found it very interesting and enjoyable.
- Through this activity students learnt about The Indian Folk Art Warli Painting (Maharashtra) and Lipan Art (Gujrat)
