One of the reasons that Bishop's continues to remain a very coveted school across the nation is the fact that we have always encouraged the all-round development of our children. Several co-curricular activities, blended into our academic structure, ensure that children can create niche areas of interest for themselves, irrespective of whether it is in the classroom, on the field, or even in theatre and music on the stage! 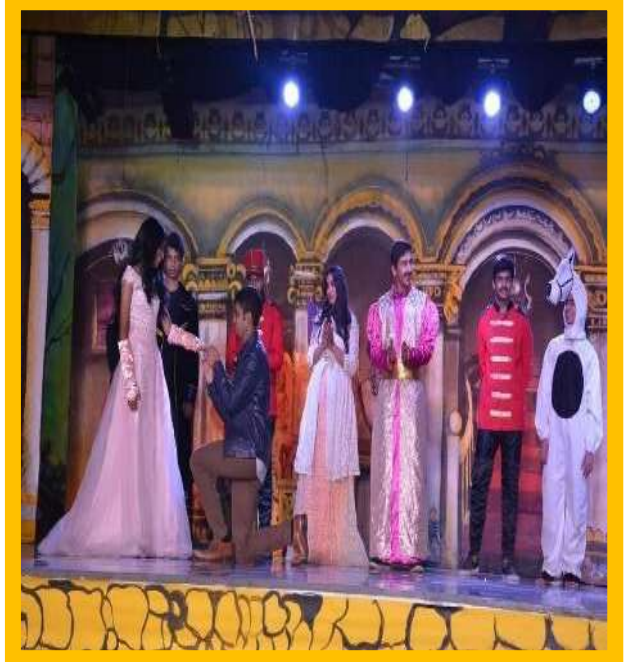
**HERE, TOO, WE ARE PROUD TO REPORT THAT ALL 244 STUDENTS WERE AWARDED FIRST DIVISION.**

The Times of India NIE Program is another program that our middle school children benefit from. A multitude of activities carried out throughout the year keep the children involved in learning beyond the classroom.

In order to keep children aware of emotional and mental health issues, we collaborate with Connecting – an NGO that brings to us the Peer Education Program. This program is rolled out only to the students of Classes 8 and 9, and the meetings conducted once every fortnight bring about a complete atmosphere of safety and security in sharing emotions and thoughts.

Every Tuesday and Thursday, the children of various classes conduct Class Assemblies. Most of these assemblies are very meaningful and are based on a theme. The enthusiasm of both, the teacher and students, remains unmatched, and Class assemblies are always enjoyable.

The activities for classes 6 to 9, based on Science, Technology and Creativity, are aimed at enhancing the quality of education through experiential learning. The children enjoyed these activities thoroughly, as it broke away from the monotony of the conventional way of learning.

Over the last few years, we have also been encouraging our children to participate in activities conducted by IUCAA. Students are encouraged to attend various interactive sessions and lectures by eminent speakers, most often conducted at the IUCAA premises on the campus of the University of Pune. The IUCAA quiz is another much looked forward to event, every year, and our teams represent us very well in this competition.

The 'Class Picnics' are another very important feature of every academic session. This is a time when children are not bound by classroom rules, and they make the most of every moment, bonding with peers and their teachers. This year, we partnered with Tigers Adventures and sent our children out to Adlabs IMAGICA, and to Magic Mountain, as well.





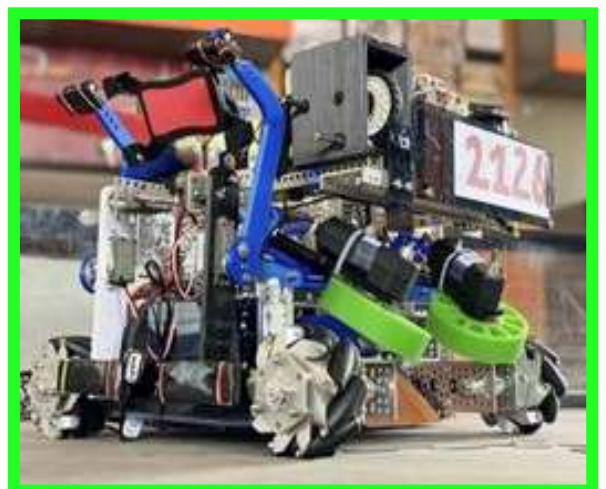

Unfortunately, for the team, and for us as a school, the global pandemic had other plans.

The team, however, continues to work towards achieving greater success with any future championships or challenges that may come their way. This year, another remarkable accomplishment was the fact that we took under our wing, a robotics team from 'Nivant' – a school for children with visual impairments. The team from Nivant was also recognized at a national level for being the first visually impaired team to participate in the First Tech Global Challenge.

One of the core values that we teach our children at Bishop's, is that charity begins at home. In order to raise funds for various outreach projects, our children organize bake sales on a larger scale, to support these causes. Organizing events like this not only teach them the principles of humanity, but also goes beyond the classroom into giving them insights into practical working of planning, organization, execution, and most importantly – finance. Visits to old age homes, orphanages, and other such institutions, keep our children in touch with ground realities of the world around us, teaching them to always keep in mind the fact that there are some who are not as fortunate as us.

Vedic Math and Abacus are an integral part of the school, and we are grateful to AURA and Mrs Varsha Shinde for conducting the Vedic Math and Abacus sessions for our children on Saturdays. 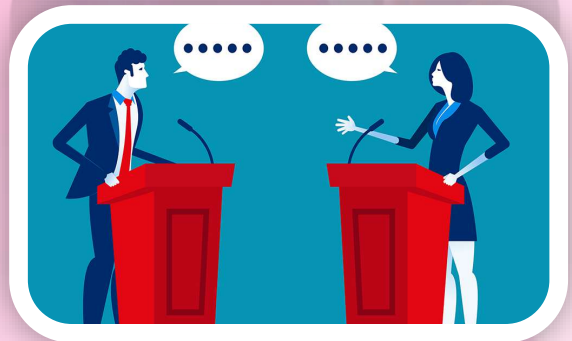
All the speakers presented their views with great confidence and validated their arguments with relevant examples.

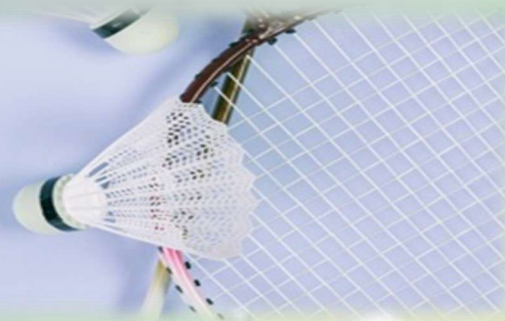

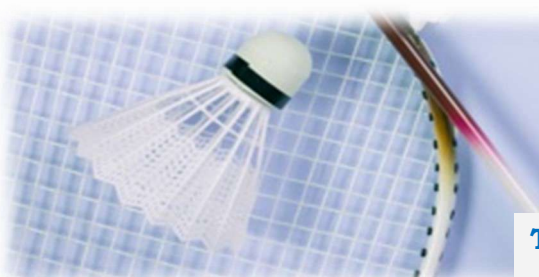

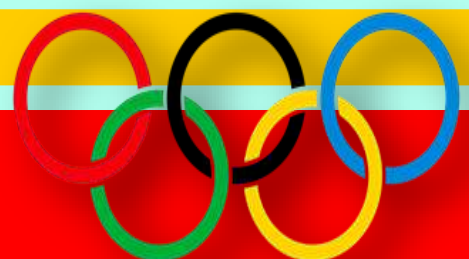

Later, the Rebus round kept everyone puzzled as they anticipated the possible answers to the questions shot by the host.

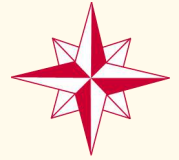

## **A VISIT TO SAMEER BELVALKAR'S STUDIO BY THE MEMBERS OF THE PHOTOGRAPHY CLUB**



Lighting is one of the most important aspects of photography because it makes the photograph dramatic and natural.

The visit to Sameer Belvalkar's Studio was very exciting. I was anxious about what I was going to learn at the studio. Twenty members of the Photography Club were accompanied by Ms. Sharon Dass, to the studio where Mr. Pratik S.B., who works with Mr. Sameer Belvalkar conducted the session.

He started the session by introducing different types of light to us. He showed us the Soft box, Para, Octa and many other filling lights. He taught us different kinds of lighting like Butterfly, Split, Rembrandt, and taught us how to choose and use the right type of lighting in photographs. He first explained how to use the right soft box and showed us the mechanism of it. A soft box is used for clicking pictures related to fashion, portraits and products.

Later, he demonstrated the Deep and Normal Octa and explained to us how to assemble and use it to click a photograph. This was followed by different variants of studio lights and their functions. He showed us the ELINCHROM FRX 400 which is a completely digital light and is one of the latest. He taught us how to use the light in different modes. He then taught us how to attach and remove the soft box and Octa in that light. Then, he showed us some other lights and equipment used for portraits and fashion photography.



He concluded the session by showing us the FRESNEL light which is a very powerful light variant and is used during outdoor shoots to create artificial light. He also taught us how to use the Para with the Fresnel light and when and why we should use Para as a filling light for our photographs.

The visit to the studio was fun, exciting and interesting. All of us enjoyed ourselves a lot and learnt about the different types of lights and how they can be used. We came to know about the importance of lighting in photography.

# **SCIENCE EXHIBITION 2019-2020**



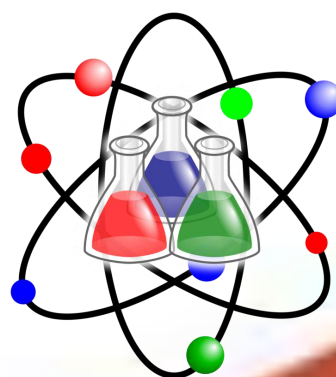
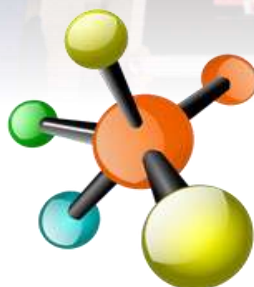

Group-2 visited Ramoji Film City- the largest integrated film studio in Telangana. It is certified as the World’s largest Film Studio complex by the Guinness World Record. Children enhanced their photography skills at various locations or sets like Bahubali set, Mahabharata and Ramayana set, London Street, Airport etc., by clicking pictures. On the 18<sup>th</sup> of December 2019 after breakfast, Group1 proceeded to Ramoji Film City and Group2 enjoyed all the adventures in the Sahas Adventure Park. In the evening, we checked into Hotel Abode where everyone enjoyed the DJ Party followed by dinner.

The next morning, after having a wholesome breakfast, the students started exploring the heritage of Hyderabad: Salar Jung Museum, Birla Mandir, Birla Science Centre- In the Science Centre, the exhibits are designed based on various laws of Physics, mechanics, perception, vibration and sounds, electricity, optical illusion etc. Children performed different activities to get firsthand experience of different concepts of science. They also got the opportunity to explore the Archaeology and Doll Museum, the Nobel Gallery, Antarctica Diorama, Dvarka Diorama and many more interesting and amazing places. The section which completely fascinated our children was Dinosaurium. It boasts of a rare collection including fossils of the Dinosaurs and Kotasaurus which dates back to 160 million years.

On the 20<sup>th</sup> of December 2019, the last day of our trip, we began the day with a sightseeing tour of Hyderabad. We first visited the Nehru Zoological Park, where we witnessed biodiversity at its best with a wide variety of birds, reptiles, and mammal's species. The site lies next to a picturesque lake and is an ideal retreat from Hyderabad's busy urban life. In the evening, we set off for the Golconda Fort – It is the most magnificent fortress complex in India which is known for its magical acoustic system. The majestic structure of the fort, palaces, and the ingenious water supply system, etc was well explained by the guide. Later in the evening, we all enjoyed the world famous and mouth-watering Paradise Biryani in the Paradise Hotel and proceeded to Secunderabad Railway Station and boarded Duranto Express for our departure back to Pune. The trip ended on the 21<sup>st</sup> of December 2019 when we reached Pune Railway Station.

It was indeed a fun trip not only by way of gaining vast knowledge about the place, but also experiencing its culinary delights by way of authentic and delicious cuisine that was served during the entire trip. 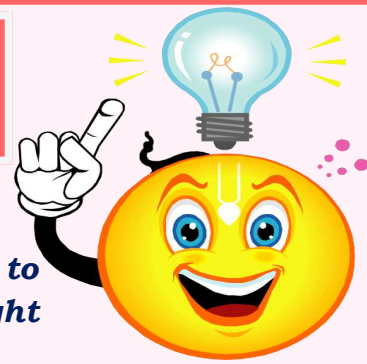

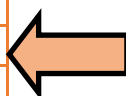
