REPORT ON "Warli Art form" - EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING ACTIVITY

"Give the students something to do, not something to learn; and the doing is of such a nature as to demand thinking; learning naturally results". - John Dewey.

Experiential Learning is a process of learning by doing. This involves engaging students using hands-on experience and reflection, which enables them to connect the theory and knowledge learnt in the classroom to real-world situations.

To impart this experiential learning, an activity on "Warli art" was conducted on 31st January 2023 at "The Bishop's Co Ed School, Undri" for the students of class 5.

Miss Amruta Kamble and her team together conducted the session in various sections of class 5. The activity was based on the Warli art form. The organizers gave them information about this art form which is a form of tribal art mostly created by the tribal people from the North Sahyadri Range in Maharashtra. Warli painting is a simple art form which uses triangular shapes. They draw inspiration from everyday life for their themes. This form of art generally depicts social life.

The students were given canvas pouches on which they drew Warli figures and designs. The students drew and painted these designs with fine marker pens. Throughout the experiential learning process the learners were actively involved. The students were encouraged to use their creativity skills and make their own beautiful designs on the given pouch.

Our students were very excited and happy to learn this Warli art form. Certainly, learning could not have been better than this.
