DAY 1: SWACCH BHARAT (PLEDGE DAY) - A REPORT

On 11th August 2023, a special assembly was held at our school to commemorate the Swachh Bharat Abhiyan, which was launched by Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi on 2nd October 2014. Students of the Jr. College initiated the day by taking the Swachh Bharat pledge, with the Head Boy leading the way. The school Principal, Mr. Julian Luke, encouraged the students to make cleanliness a habit and informed them about the government's initiatives in this regard. Day 2: REPORT ON SWACHHATA AWARENESS DAY

The Government of India had launched a nationwide cleanliness initiative in the form of "Swachhata Pakhwada" from 1st to 15th September 2023 under the Swachh Bharat Abhiyaan, announced by the Prime Minister, focusing on cleanliness and hygiene.

Under the Swachhata Awareness Days surveys were conducted on Rain Water Harvesting System, Solar Panel installation and Sanitary facilities available in School.

Through the Swachhata Pakhwada Program, the students of Class IX and X of The Bishop's Co-Ed School, Undri participated with great enthusiasm to know about Rainwater harvesting System. The whole mechanism was explained to the students by our Estate in charge, Mr. Jacob and our teacher, Mrs. Samson. The students learnt how the ground water can be charged in the years to come. They realised and learnt how every institution, school and society can implement this method and save water for our future generation.

The Bishop's Co-Ed School, Undri has always been particular about our students to get the best facilities of the toilets and washrooms. There are 4 individual buildings with 4 floors and each floor has a separate washroom for boys and girls. Girls to the left-wing. Boys to the right wing. The washroom and toilets have been built, keeping in mind modern requirements. Each washroom has been maintained well and cleaned twice a day. Water tanks are cleaned twice a year in the summer and winter breaks. The water supply in these washrooms is adequate.

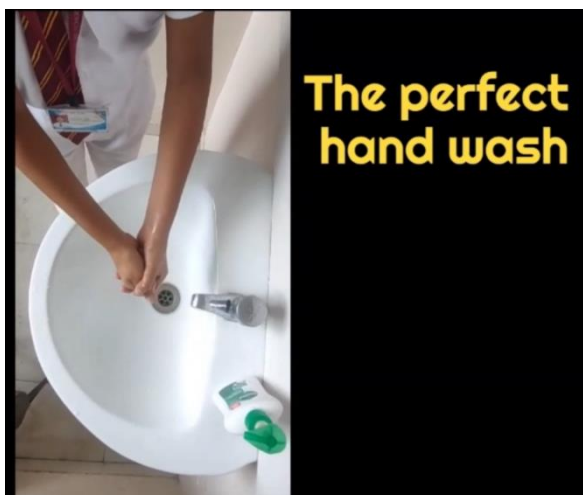

DAY 10- PERSONAL HYGIENE DAY

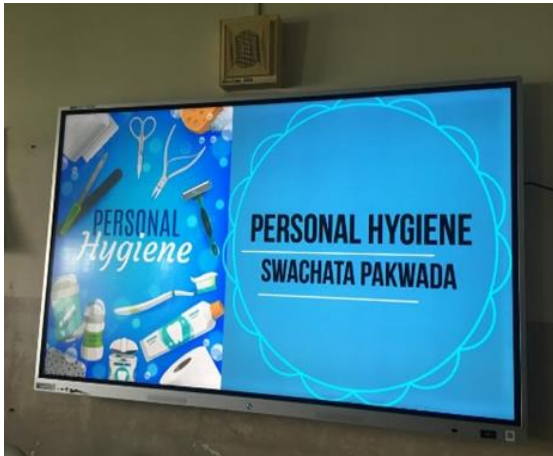

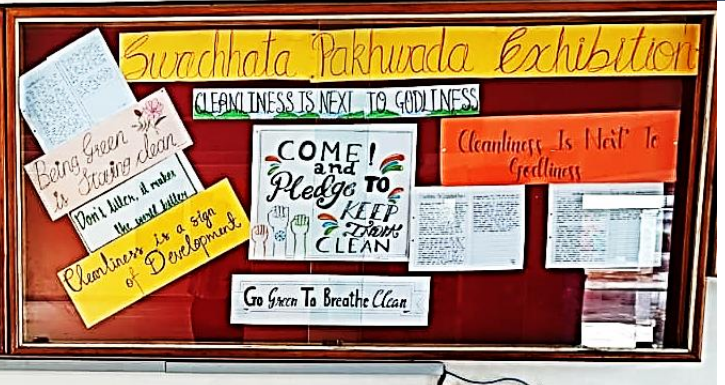
DAY 10: PERSONAL HYGIENE DAY
