REPORT ON THE PATWARDHAN DEBATE

The Patwardhan Debate stands as a hallmark event within the esteemed Pune-Mumbai Debate Circuit, drawing participants from schools across the region. With a legacy spanningthree decades, this annual debate remains a fiercely contested intellectual battleground.

Venue and Format

The 30th Edition of the Patwardhan Debate took place at the illustrious Lorna Roberts Hall within The Bishop's School Camp. This historic event unfolded over two days, on August 1st and 2nd, 2023. The participating 16 schools were divided into two pools, Pool-A and Pool-B, each consisting of eight schools. Each team comprised two participants – one advocating for the motion and the other against, culminating in a total of 32 participants.

Preparation and Execution

Pool-A:

On August 1st, 2023, the proceedings commenced in an organized manner. The teams in Pool-A gathered in the basement of Lorna Roberts Hall at 8:30 a.m. for registration and to determine the speaking order through a chitbased selection process. At 10:00 a.m., the participants were escorted into the library, where Mr. Shayne Mcpherson, our Principal, revealed the debate topic: 'Online Activism is not as effective as traditional activism in bringing about social change.' A meticulous arrangement ensured that participants had access to ample reference materials, excluding electronic devices, to support their arguments.

By 11:15 a.m., the participants assembled in the Lorna Roberts Auditorium, ready to engage in a spirited exchange of ideas. The esteemed panel of judges, consisting of Dr. A.S. Varekan, Mrs. Michelle Nahalani, and Mrs. Patricia James, presided over the debate.

Debate Proceedings

The discourse unfolded over an arduous 90-minute span, with each participant granted three minutes to present their perspective, followed by a one-minute allowance for rebuttals – limited to one per speaker. The prohibition on reading from pre-prepared texts upheld the spirit of spontaneous and well-reasoned discourse.

As the clock wound down on the rigorous debate, participants were granted a respite, partaking in a nourishing lunch before regrouping at 7:00 p.m. for the announcement of the qualifying teams. Three teams were slated to advance from each pool, solidifying their positions in the next phase of this intellectual journey.

Pool-B:

Within the vibrant tapestry of the Patwardhan Debate's 30th Edition, the teams of Pool-B infused their unique fervor into the event. Assembling in the basement of the Lorna Roberts Hall at 2:00 p.m., the participants engaged in registrations and determined the speaking order through a chit-based selection process. This process, fraught with anticipation, forged a sense of unity among the aspiring debaters.

At 3:00 p.m., the participants were led into the repository of knowledge – the library – where Mr. Shayne Mcpherson, our principal, unveiled the intellectually stimulating debate topic: 'The early bird doesn't always get the worm, but the talented one does.' Submerged in meticulously arranged reference materials, the participants embarked on a journey of preparation, driven by the desire to contribute meaningfully to the forthcoming exchange of perspectives.

By 3:15 p.m., a procession of determined debaters filled the Lorna Roberts Auditorium, poised for a spirited exchange. The esteemed adjudication panel, comprised of Dr. A.S. Varekan, Mrs. Michelle Nahalani, and Mrs. Patricia James, assumed their roles as discerningevaluators.

Unfolding Discourse: The Debate Unleashed

Over the subsequent 90 minutes, the discourse unfolded as a captivating symposium of ideas. Each participant was allocated a three-minute window to present their perspective, followed by a one-minute allowance for rebuttals – an intense opportunity for verbal sparring that tested agility and conviction.

As the clock signaled the conclusion of the intellectual duel, participants took respite during lunch, recharging for the evening's climactic moment. Reconvening at 7:00 p.m., the anticipation in the air was palpable as the unveiling of the qualifying teams loomed.



The Disclosure of the Qualifying Teams:

The participants of all the 16 schools assembled in the Lorna Roberts Hall at 7:00 p.m. anticipating the results. Before it, a short and fun games session was anchored by Mr. Clinton Fernandes which included the students and the teachers. Following this, the names of the schools of the six qualifying teams were announced (3 from each Pool). The six schools which qualified were: The Bishop's School Camp, Caelum High School, Christ Church

Bombay, The Bishop's School Kalyaninagar, St Mary's, Wisdom World Wakad. After this, dinner was served and we all departed by 8:15 p.m.
