The participantsisjere familiarised with the different rounds andegular practices were taken tọ•enhảnce their spelling skills. Mrs. N Banerjee, Mr., C Peters and Mrs. M Dşóuza were the Spell Bee Masters and Mrs. A Reddy inanaged the scores.

The competition consisted of multiple rounds designed to test the particeipants' spelliṇg skills, vocabulary, and memory. The rounds included:

1. Gadget Fun: This round involved spelling words related to various gadgets coṃmonly used in daily life. It aimed to test the student's knowledge: of technology-related terms.
2.: Mishmash: In this round, participants had to unscramble jumbled words and spiell them correctly. This round challenged the students' ability to rearrange leṭters to form meaningful words.
2. 'Orthography: The orthography round tested the participants' ability to spill woirds correctly. The students were given a series of words, and they had to spell then accurately.
3. Mémory Game: In this round, participants were required to memorize a,set of words:and then spell them correctly from memory. This round assessed the students', memory skills along with their spelling abilities.
4. Rapid-fire Round: The rapid-fire round tested the students' quick thiiitiking and spelling accuracy. The participants were given a series of words, and they hatd to spell them correctly within a given time limit.
5. Ghost Around the Gorner: This round focused on wor with silent letters. Participants had to identify and spell words that cont in de letters. It aimed to challenge the students' knowledgè öf silent Hetter attorn in words.
6. Synonym Task: The synonym task round required participants to provide a synonym for a given word. This round aimed to assess their understanding of word meanings and their ability to express similar concepts using different words.

After a series of challengivg rounds, the eompetition finally concluded. The winners were determine dosed bumulative-scores throughout the competition. The resútrts" were as follows:
