Some directives were given by the volunteers regarding the steps to be taken to pave a way for a '**Clean and Green Pune**"

Do not put wet waste in plastic covers as they have to be composted.

- Sanitary waste is to be covered with newspaper and to be marked with a red dot/cross before disposal.
- Hazardous waste should be handed over separately and not mixed with other waste. Things like broken glass pieces, ceramic items, sharp objects, nails, and knives should be put in a box which is later packed so that it does not hurt anyone who is handling the waste.

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Always cover the garbage bins.

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The volunteers then guided the students about the task to be accomplished. Weeding: The Act of removing wild plants from a place where they are not wanted. The Anandvan team helped in identifying the site and the appropriate weeds to be uprooted.

Plantation of saplings was also done by the students with full enthusiasm. The students leapt into action under the watchful eye of the teachers and gave their best in doing their bit of work. The students truly shared a fruitful experience-one which will always bring back fond memories. Such little steps taken together by the school and students will surely help in fostering strong mental and social health amongst today's children so that they connect with their peers, their elders, their community and their environment.
