

# 76th Independence Day

On the decadent morning of 15<sup>th</sup> August 2022, adorned with our nation's tricolour glory, was celebrated in the Bishop's School, Camp, the 76th Independence Day of the country. Beginning its programme at 8:30 a.m., students, teachers and parents of class 6 right up to the students of the Junior College, were assembled in the Lorna Roberts Hall, to honour those whose sacrifice is why we are able to breathe the unchained air we do today.



Scouts and troop leaders raised their bars to welcome the guests of honour—the Headmaster, Mr. Gaynor, along with the Chief Guest, Col. Atul Joshi, and his wife, governing body member, Mrs. Blossom Lillywhite, and the Junior School Supervisor, Ms. M. Barsay. The programme, moderated by Mrs. Ashwini Borde, commenced with an uplifting opening prayer by Ms. Barsay, and the solemnity was followed by the reading of a Bible verse by the Head Boy of the Junior College, Mohammed Rajkotwala, a fitting start to the performances that would lace the rest of the day.





The first of these was a delightful rendition of the patriotic song, *'Vande Mataram'* sung by students of the Junior School, that sparked smiles of pride across the hall. In continuance, Savni Apte, the Vice-Head Girl, asked all those who gathered to bow their heads to a Special Prayer for the country, and for the betterment of all its citizens.



Mr. Gaynor was then accompanied by Col. Joshi out the hall to hoist the National Flag: the most important moment of the day, graced with the singing of the National Anthem. The next voice on the podium was of Rudransh Bagal, the Head Boy of the Senior School, who led the assembly in the National Pledge.

After the dignitaries settled on the stage, Col. Joshi took to the mic and spoke of our nation's unity in its linguistic and cultural diversity. How our vision towards developing India as a whole, should be focused on harnessing the prowess of its youth in the right direction. Shining the much deserved spotlight on our teachers, he spoke about the effects of the pandemic on education, and applauded the efforts of all the teachers who were committed to ensure their students did not miss out.
