## PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

## FOR THE ANNUAL PRIZE DAY 2017-2018

#### Good evening Ladies and Gentlemen!

A warm welcome to our chief guest, Mr. Rajesh Dhabre and Mrs. Bhavana Dhabre, the Governing Body Members, invitees, my colleagues Mr. H. Soggee and Mr. McPherson, Administrative Heads of our sister Schools, Ladies and Gentlemen, boys and girls. It is indeed an honour and privilege to bring to you the Principal's Report of another successful and memorable year gone-by.

- 1. At Bishop's we uphold in practise the famous saying of Noble Laureate Nelson Mandela, "Education is the most powerful weapon which you can use to change the world". We also teach our children to "Harness their passion- to do it right- to train, to study and be prepared and to savour their accomplishments".
- 2. Determination, with a strong will to win, facing tough competition, sportsmanship on and off the field, losing with grace and yet bouncing back, team work, a Bishopite zeal, works as a formula to success and inspire others. From a very young age, all our students are taught through the various activities we have all year round----
  - One to participate- and
  - Two to never quit as every obstacle is often a stepping stone.
- Bishop's never fails to see its WORK translate into excellent results; this year was no exception, we received outstanding examination results as well as numerous achievements outside the classroom.
- 4. Ladies and Gentlemen, exceptional teaching and grooming does not happen by accident, nor do outstanding achievements. Hence we congratulate all our Class X and XII students who passed their board examinations with flying colours.
- 5. At the 2017 ICSE Examinations Devanshu Satra stood first with 97.2% and at the ISC Examination Chaitanya Doshi of the Science Stream stood first securing 97.5%, while Aman Agarwal stood first in the Commerce Stream with 95.2% and Ruhi

Kanakia stood first in the Humanities Stream 95.75%.

- 6. TRINITY SPOKEN ENGLISH EXAMINATION:
  Our students continued to take the Trinity Spoken
  English Examination and this year too they
  performed exceptionally well and were awarded
  distinctions. We would like to thank the teachers
  of the English Department, who trained the
  students so meticulously.
- 7. DEBATES: Debating is a passion amongst our senior students and I once again would like to thank the English Department for inculcating this spirit amongst our students. Apart from the Inter-Class and Inter-House Debates which are scheduled in the beginning of every academic year, we also have excelled at various Inter-School Debates. To mention a few.
  - Hitanshu Malani and Shlok Bajpai were winners at the Patwardhan Debate where Hitanshu was also adjudged the Best Speaker.
  - Om Bhansali was adjudged the second Best speaker at the Wisdom World Inter School Debate.
  - Shivam Gandhi and Maaz Modak won the runners - up team prize at the MIT New English School Debate.
- 8. QUIZ: To promote the culture of quizzing amongst our students last year we initiated a Quiz League of five rounds culminating in a Grand Quiz Final. I am happy to announce that this has generated immense enthusiasm for quizzing amongst our students.
  - Manas Agarwal, Kush Gadia and Rohan Mali won the Times Fundamental NIE Quiz Competition amongst 70 schools that participated – and were awarded a Lenovo Tablet and a Trophy.

#### OLYMPIADS

We continue to take part in various Olympiads – be it in English, Science, Mathematics, Cyber and

the NSTSC Examinations, where most of our students do very well and to mention a few,

- Minji Kim of Class 12 secured the first place in the Art Competition conducted by Schools India, bagging a Gold Medal and a cash prize of Rs. 1,000.
- Shantanu Joshi of Class 12, stood first in the SOF's International Company Secretaries Olympiad
- In the International Sports Knowledge Olympiad, Shlok Sand of Class 6 bagged the first position.
- Aadi Rave of Class 6, Aryan Verma of Class 8, Neehal Sharma of Class 11 and Siddhant Kekal of Class 12 won the Medal of Excellence in the SOF's 7th International English Olympiad.
- 10. We at Bishops believe in the holistic development of our students and in this context two overseas programmes were arranged last year. I am happy to inform you that:
  - 8 students of our school visited NASA, USA, in May 2017 and had a life-time experience of the Astronaut Training Programme at the Kennedy Space Centre, they also visited Disney Land, the Universal Studios, Smithsonian Museum, Statue of Liberty, Niagara Falls etc.
  - STUDENT EXCHANGE PROGRAMME: In 2012 we initiated a student exchange programme with the Neungin Middle School, Daegu Metropolitan City, Korea. It is with pleasure that I inform you, that since then there has been a series of Exchange Programmes between our school and the Neungin Middle School.
  - Last year a delegation of 18 students and two teachers visited the Neungin Middle School. It was a unique and matchless life experience for both teachers and the students. This year too, a delegation of 19 students and 3 teachers from Korea will be visiting our school between 31st July and 6th August, for which we have planned an elaborate programme.
  - ANNUAL CONCERT: On 17<sup>th</sup> September 2016, "Robinhood: Prince of Thieves" the Annual Concert of the Bishop's Senior School and Junior College was staged. This

- legendary tale was brought to life mesmerising a generation of students, As has always been the practice at Bishops, this was a spectacular event, which kept the audience spell bound.
- PHOTOGRAPHY CLUB: We are happy that our students have enjoyed and benefited from the Photography Club which has been functioning since the last two years. The objective of which is to enhance the students learning by introducing them to the details of photography with a more hands on experience and practical learning. Students from this Club, have participated and photographed various school functions.
- ROBOTICS CLUB: For the first time last year
  we introduced the Robotics Club to our
  students. Through the beginners course we
  familiarised the students with a mechanical
  and electrical understanding of the
  functioning of robots. This year we will be
  introducing Sensor robots along with
  programming.

#### 11. JUNIOR COLLEGE

- DISASTER MANAGEMENT: For the first time we organized a Disaster Management Lecture cum Demonstration Workshop, on 5<sup>th</sup> October 2016 for the students of Class XI with the sole purpose to empower the children to deal with challenging situations and to train them for various life and survival skills. This workshop was conducted by highly experienced professionals in their respective fields from the Military Hospital i.e. AFMC, Bomb Disposal Unit, Fire Department, NDRF and the Institute of IED Management etc. Getting all these departments on board was truly a learning curve for all our students.
- CAREER COUNSELLING: Various career counselling sessions were organized for our junior college students conducted by eminent professionals giving our students an insight to choose various career options.
- BISHOP'S FEST: We, at Bishops, have always encouraged new ideas. For the first time, an idea of the Bishop's Fest was conceived and organized solely by our Junior College students on 23<sup>rd</sup> and 24<sup>th</sup> February 2017. The entire campus was abuzz with a variety of activities such as Story-telling, Original Short

Play, It's My Line Anyway, Cook Off, interactive and informative sessions, MAD ADS, Debate, Dazzling traditional attires, Quiz competition, Essay Writing, Interactive sessions and even a Battle of Bands, involving the entire school i.e. students, their parents, staff and well wishers.

- FOREIGN UNIVERSITIES: As has been the trend in the recent past many of our junior college students apply for foreign universities mostly to the US and have also obtained scholarships not only for the exceptional results, but for the various activities that they have participated.
- All these achievements will rightly belong to our students, but a small measure of it also belongs to our teachers, parents, grandparents and guardians, who have supported, cajoled and perhaps from time to time sternly guided these young scholars both in the classroom and at home to achieve their best.
- SPORTING EVENTS: A strong sporting heritage, is what we have adopted as our legacy making it synonymous with Bishops. And it is no different today.

We continue to provide a platform for all our students to excel in a number sporting activities. We are proud to have an academy for Football, Cricket and Tennis.

We also have a dedicated Boxing coach to groom our budding boxers.

#### (I) CRICKET:

- It has indeed been a matter of pride for us, that at our Cricket Academy saw the likes of Mithali Raj, the Women's Indian Captain as well as Arjun Tendulkar, son of the Cricketing legend Sachin Tendulkar, to have trained at our very grounds under the watchful eye of our Cricket Coach, Atul Gaikwad, who also coaches the Under-16 Maharashtra Cricket Boys Team.
- Kaushal Tambe and Arya Jadhav were selected for the Under-14 Maharashtra State Cricket Team and Darshit Lunkad represented Maharashtra in the Under-16 category.

- The Under 12 and Under-14 Cricket Team won the Bishop's Invitational Triangular Tournament 2017.
- (ii) FOOTBALL: The passion of every Bishopite is Football and I am happy to announce the last academic year was an exceptionally fruitful season where our boys' football team as well as the girls won many tournaments. Some of the more important victories are as follows:
  - The Under-12 & the Open Boys team were the Winners at the Bishop's Invitational Football Tournament whereas the Under-14 boys team were the runners-up. Ryan John was awarded Best Player and Rajat Kirloskar was the Best Goalkeeper.
  - At the Zilla Parishad level, the Under-19 boys team and the Under-19 Girls team were the winners, thereby qualifying for the zonals.
  - In the Subroto Cup Tournament our Under-14 and Under 17 boys were declared division winners once again thereby qualifying for the State Level Competition. However, at the State Level both teams fell short of qualifying for the National Competition, where the Under-14 team secured the third place and the Under-17 team were the runners-up.
  - At the Maharashtra Anglo Indian Football Tournament held at the Barnes School, Devlali, our footballers were the runnersup in the boys competition.
  - Our under 14 Football team were the runners-up in the St. Vincent's Sesquicentennial Football Tournament held between 23<sup>rd</sup> and 31<sup>st</sup> January 2017.
  - Our Under-19 footballers both in the boys and girls category were the winners at the Reliance Youth Football Tournament, thereby qualifying for the National Level Competition held at Mumbai from 28<sup>th</sup> December 2016 to 2<sup>nd</sup> January 2017. For their efforts they received a sparkling trophy and a cash prize of Rs. 50,000 each.

#### (iii) NATIONAL FOOTBALL TOURNAMENT:

The performance of our footballers during the entire season paid dividend when the following boys were selected for the Under-19 Maharashtra team to play the Nationals at Jammu in the month of December 2016.

We would like to congratulate Ryan John, Karan Adhikari, Denzil Colaco and Rajat Kirloskar for their outstanding performance and for representing the State for which we all at Bishop's are extremely proud of their achievement.

Although Football takes centre-stage, our students also continued to excel in other sports.

- (iv) BASKETBALL: Our Junior College girls were the winners of the Steven Anderson Memorial Basketball Tournament held at Christ Church School, Mumbai, and bagged the third position at the Maharashtra Anglo Indian Basketball Tournament held at the Barnes School, Devlali.
- (v) SWIMMING: We continue to conduct our swimming season at the YMCA Swimming Pool for which we are very grateful to the authorities of the YMCA. Apart from the Inter-House Swimming competition which is keenly contested, some of our swimmers have excelled in the pool at various district and state level competitions.
  - At the Zonal meet Arjun Khinvasara stood second in the 100 mtrs and 200 mtrs individual medley and third in the 50 mtrs freestyle.
  - Ved Swamy secured first position in the 200 m freestyle and second in the 400 mtrs freestyle. He also stood first in Pune and fifth in Maharashtra in the Swimathon of a 5 Kms event.
  - Yash Bafna was third in the 200 mtrs Butterfly.
  - Akshat Solanki was second in the 200 mtrs Breast-stroke
  - Sohum Gosavi was first in the 100 mtrs freestyle and 200 mtrs freestyle, second in the 200 mtrs individual medley.
  - Our under-14 swimming relay team was first in the 4 x 100 mtrs freestyle and also secured the first position in the 4 x 100 mtrs medley relay.
  - At the State Swimming Competition held at Nashik the Under -14 relay team once

- again secured the first position in the  $4 \times 100$  mtrs freestyle relay and second in the  $4 \times 100$  mtrs medley relay.
- At the same meet Sohum Gosavi stood third in the 100 mtrs Butterfly and 200 m individual medley.
- In the Sakal Olympics our swimmers won 7 gold, 10 silver and 4 bronze in the various events that they participated.
- Sohum Gosavi was awarded the Individual Championship in the Under-17 category at the Mayor's Cup Swimming Competition.
- Sohum Gosavi also represented Pune in the State Aquatic Championship where he was a team member of the 4 x 100 mtrs freestyle relay, which set a new record at the Meet.
- (vi) BADMINTON: At the Zilla Parishad Badminton Tournament,
  - Our twins Dhruv and Arya Thakore were the runners up in the team event. Later at the Maharashtra Sub Junior State Badminton Championship held at Ratnagiri from 20<sup>th</sup> to 25<sup>th</sup> September 2016 they once again triumphed in the doubles event, thereby qualifying for the National Championship held at Vijayawada in Andhra Pradesh.
  - Dhruv and Arya once again did the State and the Bishop's School proud by winning the doubles event at the Championship.
  - Later in the year at the Sakal Olympics
     Dhruv was the Champion in the U-13
     category and the twins triumphed in the
     doubles event.
- (vii) GOLF: we continue to have a few budding golfers in our midst.
  - Kanishka Lunkad won the Indian Golf West Zone Feeder Tournament held at the Bombay Presidency Golf Club.
  - Was second in the Indian Golf West Zone Feeder Tournament held at the Oxford Country Golf Club and was third in the Indian Golf West Zone Freeder Tournament held at GLADE-1 and Kalhar Blues and Green.

We wish Kanishka all the best as he continues to tour the country and participate in the various golfing events.

(viii) ATHLETICS: Our Inter-House Athletic meet is one of the most sought after outdoor events as it generates a lot of enthusiasm and participation from all the students in various categories.

Our students also participate in the interschool and district level competitions. To name a few.

- In the Inter School ZP Athletic Meet, Yash Dhotre stood first in the Triple Jump
- Zuhayr Munsiff bagged the first prize in the high jump in the U-17 category
- Shubayu Datta stood first in the high jump in the U-14 category
- Jyotiraditya Pisal was first in the Shot Put event.
- All these budding athletes qualified for the State Level Athletic Championship.
- At the Maharashtra Anglo Indian Athletic Meet, the Bishop's School, Camp, were once again the overall winners, bagging 16 Gold, 20 Silver, 8 Bronze medals
- Aarav Daniels was the individual champion in the U-12 boys category.
- (ix) KARATE : Sanket Agarwal stood third in the ZP Karate Tournament

#### (x) LAWN TENNIS:

- Srijeet Sen was the winner of the singles event in the Under-17 category both at the Zonal and District Level.
- He presently holds the No. 1 position in the U-14 Boys category and will be shortly travelling to Jordan to participate in an international tennis event.
- At the Sakal Olympics our Tennis team won 3 gold, 2 silver and 1 bronze medals.
   All the above mentioned achievements were borne out of great sacrifice and never a result of selfishness. We would like to thank our PT department headed by Mr. Ramesh Bendre, and various coaches that have made it possible for

our children to give off their best.

- 13. INFIRMARY: A word of thanks to our infirmary department headed by a doctor and the nursing staff who tirelessly keep a watchful eye roundthe-clock for the good health and welfare our students and staff.
- 14. BISHOP'S ONLINE & MOBILE APPS: We at Bishop's have always been fore-runners in introducing various facilities to our students and parents. Through our Bishop's Online webpage apps the TBS Online Apps, the parents are able to access the daily announcements, homework, payments of bills etc. The Senior School and the Junior college parents can access the syllabus taught during the week.

With pleasure, I, announce that as part of the second phase, we will be shortly introducing digital diary, an online application for students leave, online income-tax certificates, bonafide certificates, request for transfer/school leaving certificates, test papers for self-assessment, real time attendance of students and also a cashless tuck-shop prepaid mode. We are also working on the School Transport GPS with new technologies.

- 15. WATER CONSERVATION: The School Management has been pro-active in dealing with the water crisis in the city of Pune, hence have invested a large sum of money in drilling bore wells to replenish the underground water levels at various points on the school campus.
- 16. SOLAR ENERGY: The Management being futuristic, are looking at alternative forms of energy and have thus installed 400 solar panels which generate. 100 Kilo watts of solar power at its peak. This power is distributed to the various locations in the school and has helped curtail our electricity expenses substantially. If there is an excess generation of solar power or if the use by the school is not required then the generated solar power is fed back into the MSEB grid. For this our school has been awarded by the Government Agency for using alternate energy.
- 17. PICNIC: A picnic to the Gravitation Techno Entertainment Park was organised in October 2016 for the senior school and a visit to Adlabs Imagica for Junior College.
- All that we do and achieve in Bishops would not be possible if we did not have a wonderful team working tirelessly.

My sincere thanks goes to the Chairman and Board of Governors for their unfailing support in the running of our institution.

I would be failing in my duty if I did not acknowledge the leadership and contribution of Mr. & Mrs Freese, who over the past 18 years have taken the Bishop's School from strength to strength and have attained the standards that many are envious of. All at Bishops will always be indebted to their contribution towards education and for inculcating the high standards of achievement in every Bishopite.

The year gone-by has achieved much to be grateful for and the credit of achievement must go the hardworking staff of our institution. I would like to compliment and thank the teachers of the Pre-Primary & Junior section, who have nurtured, loved and cared for our students in their formative years.

I would also like to say a big 'thank you' to all our teachers in the senior school and junior college for moulding the young minds and inculcating the spirit that "struggles of today will develop the strength one needs for tomorrow". For also allowing our students to imagine with all their mind, to believe with their heart and achieve with all their might, never underestimating their strengths, but always believing that all have a purpose and are placed in this institution where you can achieve more and more.

I would like to leave a few thoughts with our teachers-You should facilitate thinking, engage the minds of our students, listen to their queries, encourage them to do the unexpected, support their struggles and cultivate their dreams. With these inputs you will be teaching our students effectively and helping them to learn better with every passing day.

t gives me great pleasure to present the Junior Section Annual Report for the Academic Year 2017-18 highlighting our achievements for the year.

The school year began with us at the Junior School setting and reaching attainable goals, working harder and smarter and taking our school and student achievement to the next level of "GREATNESS". At Bishops we are dedicated to a student-centered program that promotes academic excellence through an enriched, rigorous inter-disciplinary curriculum. As a staff, we are here to support all our children, by all means necessary, to ensure that they reach their fullest academic potential. Our students have triumphed and set even higher standards as you will see from their achievements in the details which follow and which I shall outline in brief:

#### ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENTS

Academic pre-eminence in today's educational scenario continues to be an important yardstick though no longer the only one, of the school's superlative performance.

We followed the 3 Terms pattern and regular assessments were held throughout the year to ensure that the children were stress-free. There was emphasis on the quality of the day-to-day class room learning and experiences that the children encountered. However, the children of Lower KG and Upper KG followed only 2 Terms and completed worksheets in class as and when a topic was completed, to test their level of understanding of the various concepts.

The Academic achievements of our students this year has been indeed very satisfying and the meritorious performance of the ones, who went the extra mile, are truly commended.

#### THE OLYMPIADS & COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS 2017-2018

Keen to give our children a competitive edge the school hosts a number of Olympiads/ Competitive examinations each year. These Olympiads have in recent times emerged as an alternative to no-exam/continuous assessment models and have helped boost the children's confidence levels.

As always we had a phenomenal response and about 1,497 eager and enthusiastic students participated in the different Examinations. The following 5 Examinations were conducted by the Science Olympiad Foundation, New Delhi:

- The National Science Talent Search Examinations
   101 boys participated
- The National Science Olympiad 190 boys participated
- The International Mathematics Olympiad 303 boys participated
- The International English Olympiad 176 boys participated
- The International General Knowledge Olympiad 149 boys participated

#### We also had -

- The National Cyber Olympiad conducted by the Unified Council, Hyderabad in which 91 boys participated
- The Art Olympiad by Schools India had 487 boys participating.

We are extremely proud of Malhar Dindokar, Sagnik Kar, Aarush Kumar, Sanidhya Saraf to name a few who did tremendously well in these Competitive Examinations.

#### • TRINITY SPOKEN ENGLISH

Trinity College London is an international examination board, fully accredited in the United Kingdom as an independent awarding body. The Graded Examinations have always been an integral part of the Bishop's School Academic Curriculum and the Academic Year 2017-2018 was no exception.

This year 260 students registered and appeared for the Trinity Spoken English Examinations. They were trained by 10 of our efficient and competent staff.

The examinations were held from the 12<sup>th</sup> -16<sup>th</sup> of February 2018. The examiner from the UK, Mr Leslie Cox was most impressed with the confidence level of our students which was reflected in the exemplary grades that our students obtained. 200 students were

granted 'Distinctions', 57 students passed with 'Merit' and 03 of our students received the 'Pass' certificate.

#### EDUCOMP SMART BOARDS

The aim of providing smart boards in the classroom was to prove the effectiveness of incidental instruction, rather than just 'book knowledge' so as to make education more interesting. We are happy to inform you that all our classrooms are now equipped with the Educomp Systems and the teaching-learning process has hence now received a technological enhancement.

#### SPARKLES

Specific learning difficulties can make it difficult and sometimes impossible for a child to achieve the same results as his peers in a traditional classroom setting. Thus many children who face these difficulties are at risk of developing low self-esteem, particularly when their condition goes undiagnosed and/or untreated. The school being sensitive to the needs of such children recognized that there are alternative learning approaches, strategies, and tools that can help students achieve their full potential at school. Under the able guidance of the School Psychologist Dr. Mrs. Y. Singh and her team of Counsellors and Remedial Educators namely Ms Alifya Sarjan and Ms Janine Garda who always adorn a positive attitude; I can proudly state that the children attending our 'Sparkles Activity' are faring extremely well and are motivated to persevere further.

#### CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

The school looks at each learner as a unique 'whole person' with inherent genius, special capabilities and unlimited potential. By providing a conducive and encouraging environment the learners are mentored to participate in a variety of co-curricular school activities/competitions. These help them not only to showcase their talents, hone their skills but these also entail opportunities that lead to multi-dimensional growth of their physical, social, intellectual and spiritual being.

#### 1. Inter-Class Spell Bee Competition

In the time and age of auto-correct, predictive text and spell check, the Spell Bee Competition of The Junior Section came as a breath of fresh air. It was held on the 9th, 10th and 11th of August 2017. The spelling wizards of the Junior Section participated with great enthusiasm and duelled through the toughest words in

seven challenging rounds to prove their mettle. The interesting rounds were woven around homonyms, synonyms palindromes, etc.

The competition not just made students aware of spellings and the usage of unfamiliar words but it also served to enrich the vocabulary bank of the students.

#### 2. The Inter-Class Quiz Competition

The exciting Inter-Class Quiz Competition 2017-18 for the junior school was conducted from 11<sup>th</sup> October to the 13<sup>th</sup> of October, 2017. We here at Bishop's definitely believe in healthy competition and as Colin Powell has rightly said, "The healthiest competition occurs when average people win by putting above average efforts", so it was for our budding quizzers who put in their best foot forward as they battled through a plethora of visual, audio-visual and quick thinking rounds with the questions ranging from English Literature, Science, Geography to current affairs. I can proudly say that our boys displayed brilliant quizzing talent!

#### 3. The Inter-Class English Elocution Competition

This year, the Interclass English Elocution Competition was held from 26<sup>th</sup> to 28<sup>th</sup> February, 2018. Every day, the school corridors resounded with the magnificent voices of the young elocutionists trying to perfect their skills in oration. The judges, who were no strangers to us as they hailed from our Kalyani Nagar branch, were favourably impressed by the flawless diction, the wide range of expressions portrayed by the individual representatives who came forward to showcase their talents with gusto.

The group elocution held everyone captivated echoed one judge and the choice of poems and perfect delivery were second to none said another. The results were declared amidst much suspense and were received with much applause.

This Tournament provided a platform for students to improve on their logical thinking, analytical reasoning and problem solving skills.

Udayan Deshmukh of 1-E started swimming at the age of 3 and last year participated in five major state level competitions of which he won four championships. 
## Annual PRIVE DAY














## The Bishop's Invitational Football Tournament

The brain battle had two varieties, the players played for their houses, as well as for themselves.


An Inter-House tournament was held for the

#### ART AND ESSAY COMPETITION

Self expression through language and art is an essential part of learning. Keeping this in mind, the 17<sup>th</sup> All India HOPE Talent contest - Art and Essay competition conducted by Schoolsindia, Chennai was held with full zest and fervour in our school from classes I to XII where 563 students participated in the Art competition and 103 students took part in the Essay writing competition. The children showcased their creative skills in art and essay writing and came up with amazing work. Our 7 boys won gold medals, 14 boys won silver medals and 17 boys received bronze medal.

#### **COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS IN OUR SCHOOL**

We at The Bishop's School provide a unique competitive platform for our students and identify the young geniuses and create a talent pool for the future. Knowledge is useless without application-keeping this in mind we encourage our students to participate in various competitive examinations in different subjects. Competitive exams make them use their logical reasoning skills, test a student's problem solving ability and challenge them to think analytically.

The following were the examinations conducted for class 3 to class 12 during the academic year 2017-2018 along with their results.

### SOF-INTERNATIONAL ENGLISH OLYMPIAD RESULT

We had registered 419 students for this exam. Our students astounded everyone through their performance thereby achieving 32 gold medals, 10 silver and 10 bronze medals.

#### SOF-NATIONAL SCIENCE OLYMPIAD RESULT

438 students participated in this exam. Our boys won 11gold medals, 10 silver medals and 10 bronze medals.

### SOF-INTERNATIONAL GENERAL KNOWLEDGE OLYMPIAD RESULT

There were total 276 students enrolled for this exam, out of which our boys brought laurels to the school by winning 10 gold, 7 silver and 7 bronze medals.

### SOF-INTERNATIONAL MATHEMATICS OLYMPIAD RESULT

Our students showcased their talent and skill and bagged 13 gold medals, 11 silver medals and 11 bronze medals.

#### **SOF-NATIONAL CYBER OLYMPIAD RESULT**

212 students participated in the Cyber Olympiad. Our 11 boys bagged gold medals, 8 boys won silver medals and 10 boys won bronze medal.

### BHASKARACHARYA MATHS TALENT SEARCH EXAMINATION
















### The Bishop's Model United Nations

The Bishop's Model United Nations conducted its first conference on the 5<sup>th</sup>, 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> of January, 2018, at The Bishop's School Camp. Over 210 delegates came in from the farthest corners of our country; there were 25 delegates from Rameswaram, the southernmost tip of Tamil Nadu. A total of six of committees were simulated successfully for students from Class 7 onwards.

The Bishop's MUN started off as an activity conducted by a few ex-students in collaboration with the school. It was started to give the students an early exposure to international affairs and foreign policies and also to help inculcate leadership qualities and negotiation skills which are necessary to make future leaders of the world.

On the first day, an informal ice-breaking session was conducted to give the delegates an opportunity to personally familiarise themselves with the Executive Board members of the conference. The delegates were briefed by the Chief Advisor of the conference, Ashwath Komath, regarding the procedures and regulations to be followed during the course of the conference.

On the next day, the event was inaugurated by the Chief Guest, Colonel Lalit Rai VrC, and the Principal, Mr. Joel Edwin. The colonel narrated how he took over the command of the elite Gurkha Rifles of the Indian Army while leading Operation Vijay. He led his battalion into one of the fiercest battles – the Kargil war, on the formidable heights of Khalubar, in the Batalik sector, at altitudes of over 18000 feet and in freezing temperatures below minus 30 degrees Celsius. Despite grave bullet and splinter injuries on his legs and profuse bleeding, the brave Commanding Officer led his men from the front to success. Through his narration, the colonel spoke about the four pillars of life which make one's foundation strong and solid.

Following the ceremony, all committees began their sessions. The committees and their respective agendas were:

- Disarmament and International Security (DISEC): Humanitarian consequences of nuclear weapons
- Economic and Financial Committee (ECOFIN): Eradication of poverty and other development issues: Women in Development



- Social Humanitarian and Cultural Committee (SOCHUM): Elimination of racism, racial discrimination, xenophobia and related intolerance.
- United Nations Commission on the Status of Women (UNCSW): Empowerment of indigenous women
- United Nations Commission on Crime Prevention and Criminal Justice (UNCCPCJ): Preventing and combating trafficking in human organs and trafficking in persons for the purpose of organ removal.
- United Nations Human Rights Council (UNHRC): Rights of persons belonging to national or ethnic, religious and linguistic minorities.

One of the highlights of the conference was the State Dinner. It was a night of riveting music and scrumptious food. It was a first of its kind dinner conducted at an MUN conference.

With highly intellectual discussions and engrossing debates, all the committees came up with resolutions pertaining to their respective agendas by the last day of the conference. Foreign policies were discussed and negotiations done to come to a unanimous conclusion to tackle the grave issues that threatens humanity today.

The highly successful conference ended on a high note with delegates being awarded prizes for their performance in the committees, followed by an address from the President, Sahil Nahar, the Principal, Mr. Joel Edwin and a concluding speech by the Secretary General, Raavi Uttarwar.


Ivy Cottage, Landour

climbed the famous red narrow, steep steps to the first floor of the cottage and a pleasant faced gentleman climbed out beyond the french doors. I stared open mouthed. It was really him, blood and flesh. It was Bond, Ruskin Bond.

A leading bookstore chain Landmark Stores initiative with Scholastic India had organised a story telling competition Child Reading to Child, and I won the title and joined two other winners from different cities in India to meet none other than Ruskin Bond all the way to Landour, Mussoorie.

On 29th September we reached Ivy Cottage in Landour at 10.30am. We were half an hour before the scheduled time and we were really in a dilemma. His adopted son Rakesh informed the legendary writer about our early arrival. He greeted us with a heartwarming smile and invited us upstairs and we were very much surprised how humble and down to

earth such a famous person can be! We sat and talked for two hours in his sitting room and as expected it was full of books, trophies and photographs and the aroma that is ever present in his stories. Ruskin Bond told us about the various nuances of writing, the importance of being an avid reader and possessing the ability to sit patiently for hours and hours at the end listening to the calls of the wild. ' How does creme de menthe taste? ' one of the initial question which I asked him. I had read the recipe written by Bond in his book' The Adventures of Miss Ripley Bean, Death under the Deodars'. Questions after questions were posed by me to him and finally he gave a pat on my back and in a low voice told me, the words I will treasure for my whole life. 'Shlok, my boy! he chuckled, you know all the secrets of my personal and culinary life. I am sure I did not write all this in my books. His first book according to Ruskin Bond which he ever wrote ended in the dustbin and he became a subject of ridicule for weeks in his school. The book was actually a character

sketch of all the teachers in his boarding school and a person does not have to be a genius to know his opinion about his teachers who whacked him with a belt on every possible occasion. I asked him if he really had an Uncle Kim and if Kim was really as light in the head as portrayed in his books. He told me that his uncle really existed and was a bit eccentric but all the haywire tales that Ruskin Bond mentioned was a work of fiction. Mr Bond mentioned that those days quite a few ghosts and prets troubled him and he had been hearing strange noises at night. I suggested that it might be the ghost of an angry Uncle Kim or any other aunt or uncle he had ridiculed in his books. Everyone in the room burst out laughing and I was afraid that I had taken a step too far but fortunately with all due credit to Mr Bond he took it very sportingly. I handed him a handwritten letter brought along for him and also requested him to sign the set of Ruskin Bond books that I had carried from home. He has got such a longhand lovely handwriting and the best part was he wrote a personal message for me with his autograph on all my books.

On writing good books, he told us, 'A good book can only be written and enjoyed if the words come

from the deepest abyss of our heart. 'According to him, setbacks are a daily part of life. Don't be disappointed if things don't go well in the beginning. Patience is the virtue of the wise, not the pastime of the foolish. He published his first book at the age of seventeen and it took him fifty long years to become a household name. These philosophical words intrigued me and I 'm sure made me far wiser than before. Finally after two hours my wonderful tryst was over. I walked out of the cottage in a trance. There was so much I wished I could have spoken. Maybe I will get a chance later again. Until then Mr. Bond, farewell!

As I stood on the narrow pathway 6500 feet above sea level I looked back at the beautiful Ivy Cottage adorned with Tibetan Thangka paintings. I couldn't believe that I met Rusty. The same Rusty who grew up on the lush green mountains.....who rode around Dehra with Somi, Kishen, Sudhir and Devinder.... who went to England and came back to the beautiful Himalayas and never left again. I met my idol.

SUPW is a subject in school wherein students are made to actively participate in a number of vocational education activities, for e.g. gardening, painting, carpentry, cooking and other crafts.

This year two major activities were organized for the students of class 10.

#### TERM-I

Class 10 A students, along with their Class Teacher and Asst. Class Teacher, went to 'Shiv Foundation' at Kamshet which is 58 kms from Pune for a Tree Plantation drive. The students participated

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### The Sparkles Activity Report

" HELPING MAKE A DIFFERENCE"
OR

"EVERY CHILD CAN LEARN.

JUST NOT ON THE SAME DAY, OR IN THE SAME WAY"

S parkles is a venture of the Bishop's School, to provide a well-connected and supportive system to children especially those with special needs, either due to psychological or physiological reasons.

'Special needs' is an umbrella term underneath which a staggering range of diagnoses can be wedged. Children with special needs could have mild learning difficulties or profound intellectual disability; developmental delays that are easily identified or remain hidden; food allergies or terminal illness; mild anxiety or serious psychiatric illnesses. This diagnosis helps in providing the necessary services, setting suitable goals and gaining a holistic understanding of the child.

Sparkles helps facilitate the emotional, physical, cognitive and social development of children. The Sparkles program promotes well-being by providing a platform to aid children to strengthen their coping abilities to counter environmental stress, enhance academic success, reduce school drop outs and provide preventive and therapeutic mental health care.

Mental health professionals work extensively with teachers, parents and other health specialists to form partnerships between parents and educators.

Since the inception of the Sparkles program, 17 years ago, a blue-print with consistent methodology is followed, however, updates and changes to the program occur in strict accordance with the changing legal educational system.

The Sparkles Program functions on a 3-step approach:

- Preventive Mental Health: Aims at creating awareness in children, educators and parents through workshops, training and life-skills education.
- 2) Identification/Diagnosis/Assessment: Children believed to be "at risk" are referred to the Sparkles department through parents and teachers; who in turn connect with outside agencies and hospitals for psychoeducational assessments and clinical diagnosis.
- 3) Intervention: Children with diagnosed learning difficulties/ IQ issues/ ADHD/ PDD or visual, hearing or motor impairments and other medical conditions are provided constant support, through



individual counseling and remedial education classes.

Assistance in the following (but not limited to) areas are provided as well:

- Access to a resource room for remedial education and play/music & dance/art/ animal-assisted and other therapies.
- Sensory-Integration Activities- Cooking, planting and other activities
- Computer aided interactive learning
- Note taking assistance
- Monitoring and progress feedback
- Exam accommodations- such as shadow teachers, providing writers, use of magnifying glass and calculators, question papers in large font size, extra time and soft corrections

Sparkles thereby, focuses on the importance of collaborative work between teachers, parents and students, with a hope of constructively engaging students themselves to bring about positive transformations.

To ensure the best chance of success for our children in the long run, the focus is on helping them develop important life skills and pay attention to their physical and emotional well-being.

The aim is to look for ways to help children to help themselves and to give them the social and emotional tools they need to work through challenges.

In the long run, facing and overcoming a challenge such as learning or other difficulty will help the child grow stronger and more resilient, which is what we wish for all our students.





I now look forward to my next adventure






Running is a popular form of exercise. It is also one of the oldest forms of sport.





His hobby is cycling. He likes to perform stunts on his cycle. He likes to skate, to balance on the front and back wheel and to do back-flip and front-flip.





Since then 28 summers Olympic and 23 winter Olympics have been held across 23 cities of the world. The games were not held in 1916, 1940 and 1944 because of World War 1 and 2.

The International Olympic Committee [IOC] was formed in 1890 in Paris. The rules of the games were formed by the IOC and the first summer Olympics were held in 1896. The Olympic symbol consists of 5 interlocking rings coloured blue, red, black, Yellow and Green. The five rings represent the 5 continents of the world. The Olympic torch is ignited several months before the opening ceremony of the games at the site of the ancient Olympics in Olympia, Greece. For every sporting event there are 3 medals. The bronze medal is given for the third place, the silver medal is given for the second place and the gold medal is given for the first place. USA has won the maximum medals in Olympic history. Every Olympic event has games like football, boxing, tennis, swimming etc. Each sport has team events as well as individual events. India has won 9 gold medals, 7 silver medals and 12 bronze medals so far in the Olympic Games. The last summer Olympics were held in Rio, Brazil.





#### SHARING SOME INFORMATION WITH YOU REGARDING MY FAVOURITE ANIMAL

ot very long ago the polar bears were added to the list of threatened species and will now receive special protection under the U.S. Law. In his statement, Interior Secretary, Dirk Kempthorne noted that the decline of the Arctic Sea ice is the greatest threat to the bears.

Polar bears live in the Arctic and hunt seals and other marine mammals. "Because polar bears are vulnerable to this loss of habitat, they are, in my judgement, likely to become endangered in the foreseeable future," Kempthorne said.

Although many scientists say that human activity is directly responsible for the melting sea ice, the new polar bear protection law will not change the U.S. Climate policy.

The U.S. Classifies the polar bear as a marine mammal, which means that the bear's new threatened status will not stop oil exploration within its habitat.

## Polar Bears Soon To Be Extinct

Hunting of polar bears as a food source by certain natives and for trade in native handicrafts will also continue. However, importing polar bear products from Canada (where trophy hunting is legal) will be banned.

Scott Bergen, a landscape ecologist with the New York based wildlife conservation society noted that saving the Polar Bear will depend on international cooperation. Permanent sea- ice habitat is likely to remain in areas outside of the U.S. particularly in Canada and Greenland.

Scientists view these areas as refuges that could allow some polar bear population to survive over a long term and repopulate the Arctic if temperatures decrease and sea ice returns.

'If you take a long term view – meaning a hundred year view into the future,' he said, 'polar bears existence is not necessarily dependent on what happens in the United States.'

## Autobiography of 'A SEA'








